

Ground regulations

- 1 **Tickets, season tickets, passes or other forms of accreditation entitling the holder to be at the stadium** must be presented at the request of stewards, police or any other authority. Spectators must also be willing to be searched by a steward.
- 2 **Spectators must use the seat or stand stated on the ticket** unless allocated a different seat/stand by a steward or other staff.
- 3 **Recording of live images or audio material** and disclosure of information from the match, stands and other areas of the ground for commercial use is not permitted regardless of the means.
- 4 **It is not permitted to cover signs and advertising billboards with banners** without prior agreement.
- 5 **Racist, homophobic** and other derogatory or discriminatory abuse or behaviour are strictly forbidden.
- 6 **Video surveillance** can be present at the stadium for security purposes.
- 7 **Violation of the Superliga ground regulations** may result in a person being expelled without further notice and possibly being charged a fee and/or a banning order from the stadium. Expelled visitors are not entitled to a refund on their ticket or pass.
- 8 **Local stadium rules and regulations and directions of any steward** must also be followed.
- 9 **The above points are not exhaustive.**

Bans and charges for violations

- A It is forbidden to trespass the fence surrounding the football pitch or to gain access onto the playing area in any other way.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 10,000.
- B It is forbidden to possess or use pyrotechnics at the stadium or in close proximity of the stadium area.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 5,000.
- C It is forbidden to throw objects on or towards the pitch or at other spectators.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 5,000.
- D It is forbidden for anyone under a banning order to attempt to access or to be inside the stadium.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 5,000.
- E It is forbidden to possess or wear face concealing masks or otherwise cover the face, fully or partially, to prevent identification at the stadium or in close proximity of the stadium area.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 5,000.
- F It is forbidden to display threatening behaviour, encourage or engage in violence at the stadium or in close proximity of the stadium area.**
Violation will result in a charge of DKK 5,000. In particularly serious cases or if the behaviour is directed towards staff, the charge can be increased to DKK 10,000.

The Superliga clubs have agreed that harassment of staff, or contribution to harassment, inside or outside the stadium - including, but not limited to, police officers, stewards and sales staff - will result in a minimum of a two-year club banning order. In more serious cases, a club banning order may be imposed for a four-year period.

Payment of the above charges does not exclude the imposition of other penalties and prosecution, including claims for compensation.

The ground regulations have been endorsed by all clubs in the Superliga.

The purpose of the ground regulations in the Superliga is to allow football match spectators to feel safe and secure before, during and after the stadium event. Everyone is welcome at the ground, irrespective of age, appearance, religion and cultural background. The ground regulations apply to the stadium and the close proximity of the stadium area, including entrances to the stadium, pitch-side, on the stands and in the areas around the stadium, such as the main building, the fire escape routes around the stadium and affiliated parking areas.
